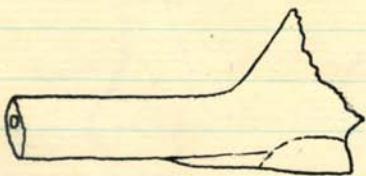

Henry Rickuss married at Much Wenlock in 1758 as a pipemaker.

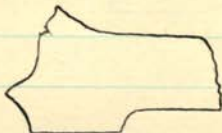

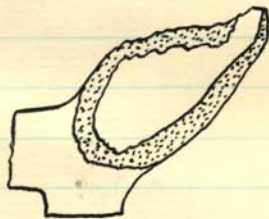
