
## INTRODUCTION: VOL. 37

This volume was started on Jamany, 14th, 1984 and was completed on January 10th, 1987.



Note that bowls 3788 - 3796 were found is diedying from a new at Colchester, and thus most of the pipe are known products from the location, the notable exception being 3796. Although many early pipes were apparently discovered, very few had any makes marks on them.
