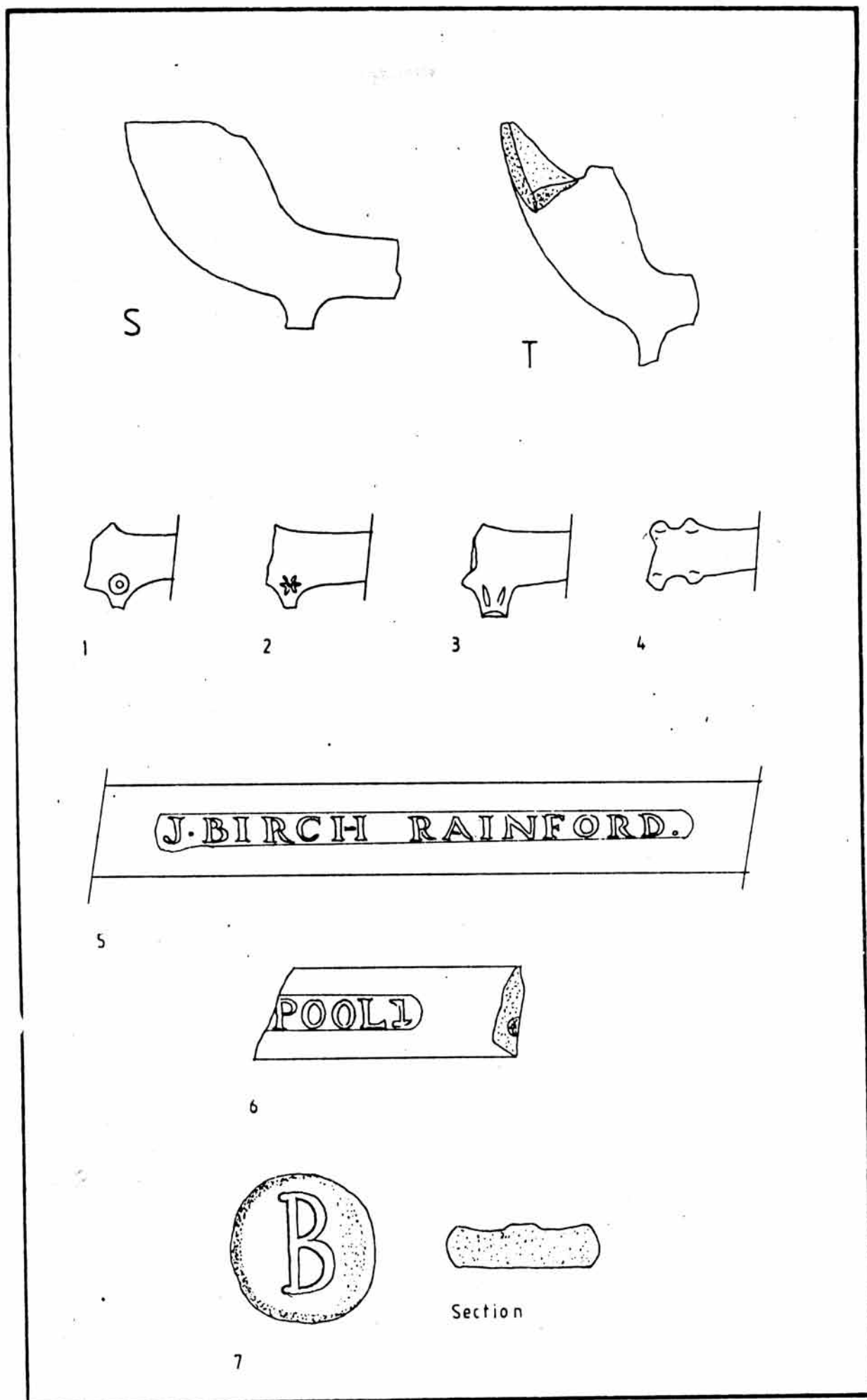


Fig. 4. Pipes S - T, spurs and stems 1 - 6, token.

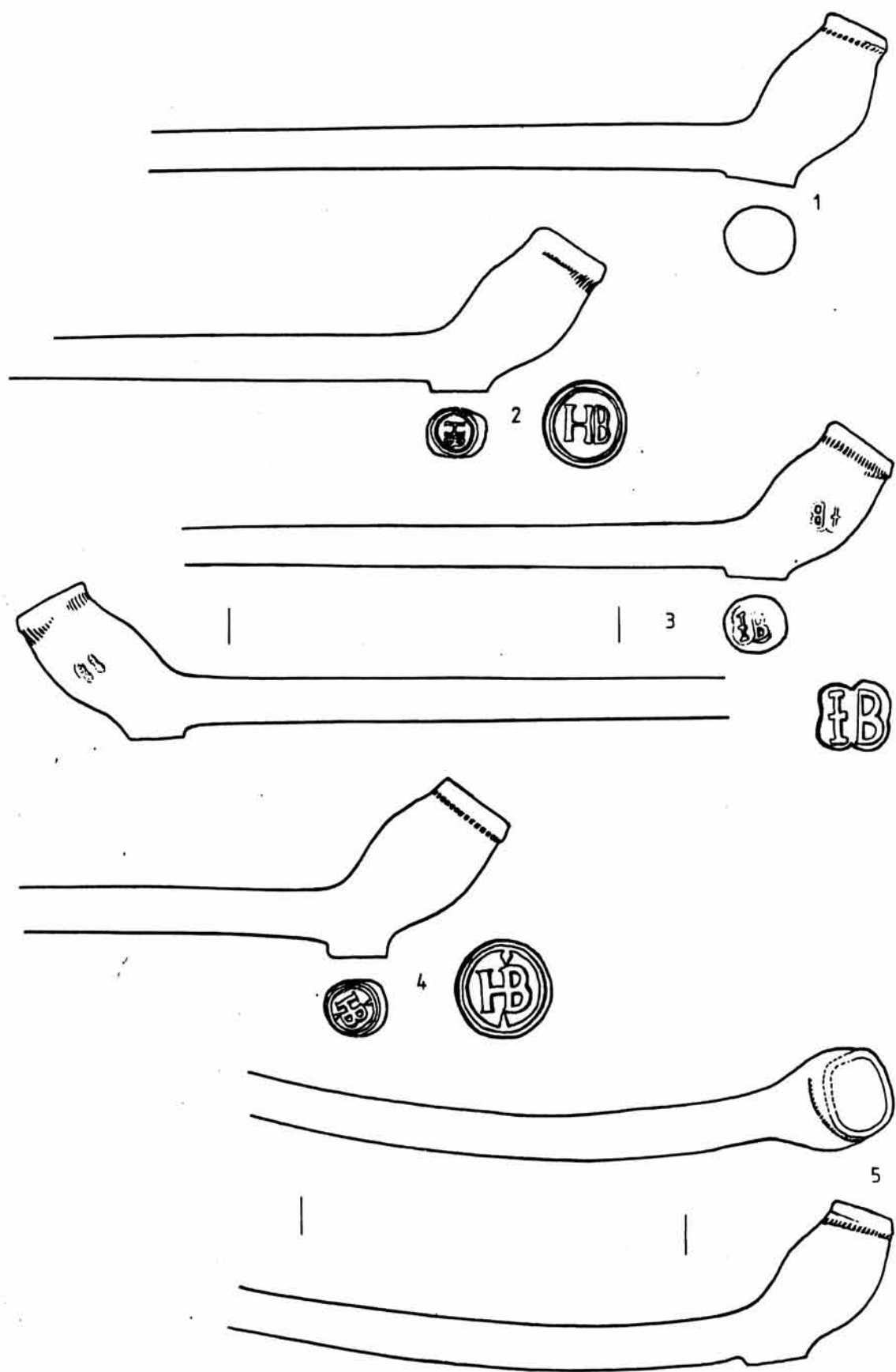


Fig. 22. Rainford, Site 9. Mould and stamp types: pipes 1:1.

This group of pipes is in the Spalding Gentlemens Museum and merely labelled found in Spalding. but contained in a tin box and clearly found as a group. They show the use of 7 different moulds of which 2, 3, 4 and 7 with button tops are the earlier 1 and 5 have knife cut tops and are probably later.

Bilby's inventory gave his estate as £37-5-0 fairly prosperous for a pipemaker. His tools were worth £3 and he had £3 worth of coals implying his kilns were not woodburning at least at the time of his death whereas Mathew Hebblethwaite of Lincoln whose inventory of 1729 was worth £19-15 and listed wood for burning.
