





We have a collection of 14 spurs: a slight difference in the length and width of the spur at the junction with the bowl puts them into two groups, A & B. All I would think are early or middle 19th C. The initials come out as follows:- Group "A"  $\stackrel{?}{\rightarrow}$  B L and B with the L reversed.

Group "B" - L B both reversed and BL both reversed All they suggest to me is a mould maker with little pride in his work. Do they mean anything to you. I suppose they might be early products of Len Bishop's. If a mould-maker could engrave(?) initials the wrong way round, I suppose he would be just as likely to put them on the wrong halves of the mould, in which case these could all be injended for "BL" since that is the only pair which is the right way round. I'll blow a roll of eight negatives on these if they are of any interest

Dear Mr Oswald,

I am writing with reference to a clay tobacco-pipe which you published in "Clay pipes for the Archaeologist" (Fig.16, No.6) which depicts the Grocer's Company Arms with initials MB, dated to c.1650.

I assume this is the same pipe of which a drawing was sent into Winchester City Museum for identification in September 1973. The pipe was found in the garden of Dr. R.S. Millard, Draper's Cottage, High Street, Odiham, Hants. It was sent to David Atkinson for a further opinion, and in a letter to us he stated that he had discussed it with you.

The pipe has recently been sent into the museum again, and on cleaning it I noticed that the initials were not MB but N followed by B, R or K.

I would be grateful if you have any further information of this type of pipe, and whether any others have turned up since your publication in 1975.


