
Comments: These are marks with an C surname initial. Arranged alphabetically by Surname (i.e. AC, BC, CC, DC etc.). Each section starts with a typed list of giving details, including provenance for each piece, which have an identifying number that is a simple sequence of numbers (i.e. 1, 2, 3 etc.) occasionally with sub-lists, if there are more than one example (i.e. 1a, 1b, 1c, 2a, 2b, etc).

Just before I have to return to town for a few days some new info. for you to digest on a family of pipemakers who I believe were probably important in their time but of whom little bis known.

For quite a few years now I have been puzzled by a series of attractive pipes dating from c.1780-1820 which keep cropping up from Hampshire collections or excavated material. These have either a pointed spur or large square type spur and bear large serif initials A/C. The designs include royal arms(more than one mould) fluting and beading(early forms, large bowls) or masonic emblems. Also some very attractive early flower designs.

I have noted these from The Pewsey Collection from Hythe(of which I was given a selection) the Cooper Collection(Winchester), Winchester Museum, Winchester Research Unit material, Portsmouth Museum, Portsmouth(Oyster St) excavations, Southampton Museum and

excavated material from Southampton sites.

AC.

The 1976 Upper Bugle Street material, which I have just been through for my initial record produced a fine Masonic pipe with square spur(star each side) and on the stem in relief T.(or F) COSTER/ FAREHAM with leaves, arrows etc. Having heard the name but not seen any pipes I looked up your BAR14 and noticed in your Hampshire list Fanny, Thomas and Arthur Coster, 1841 census, all at Fareham. By their ages these must have been the offspring of the man who made the pipe in question.

A further puzzle now was the fact that in addition to Thomas Frost 'Trafalgar' pipes the same design occasionally occurs with initials T/C. Also, in the latest material, there are two fluted bowls of c.1800-10 which show traces of T.FROST/SOUTHAMPTON moulded in relief round the lip in large letters, half of which are off the pipe due to the slicing off process. This discovery is too late for Walker's paper unfortunately, but it rang a bell in my mind, for I had seen in the Southampton Museum collections a pipe with lettering round the lip in similar style which at the time of my visit some years ago I could not decipher. Also I remembered something similar in Pewsey's pipes from Hythe, one of which I had fortunately kept when Coleman-Smith offered me the pick some years ago. I looked up the relevant box and found thebpipe in question, a tall crudely fluted bowl which had lost its spur, of c.1790-1800, just like some of the A/C ones.A close inspection through a glass has revealed that it has engraved round the lip, half among the tops of the flutes ARTHUR COSTER : What about that ! So it looks as if the problem of the numerous A/C pipes is now solved. This man appears to have started work about the 1780's for his Royal Arms pipes, though well engraved, are of the thin-walled, thin-stemmed type which were in use just before the appearance of the 'square' type spurs in the 1790's.

It would be interesting if someone could now found a documentary

record of Arthur and T.Coster at Fareham during the period in question, c.1780-1820. Strangely, despite my familiarity with the pipes of the area after many years of research I have not seen any which may be attributed to the three 1841-51 Costers, not even initials on spurs. Judging by the Sayer Fareham stamped marks of the earlier Cl8th and the later Goodall family working there it appears that Fareham was quite an important pipemaking centre for some considerable time, inspite of the rivalry from

the larger nearby towns of Portsmouth, Southampton and Winchester (though the last named probably had no maker between c.1780 and 1820, when the Bakers began working).

Those described below are from the following sites along the Thames: Craven Steps, Putney Bridge, Fulham, Hammersmith and Barnes. None have the mould line trimmed off under the spur.

1. Square spur, large initials, plain heavy fluting, c.1810.

- 2. Square spur, less wide, leaves up mould lines, male figure kneeling on left and female standing on right. c.1820
- Square spur, large initials, rows of fluting and beading, heavy design, tiny leaves up the mould lines(most unusual so early), riband around lip.
- 4. Square spur, large initials, flutes to half-way up bowl, above that 'classical' type decoration. c.1810-20
- 5. Similar to No.4 but larger bowl, narrower spur. c.1820
- 6. Square spur, large initials, alternate rows of fluting and small stars, leaves up mould line. c.1810-20

Similar pipes from the same sites have I/S, I/P, I/C, G/B and M/B or a rosette each side of the spur. Some have leaves along the stem for a short way but none appears to have had names or addresses, possibly because the fashion had barely begun. The I/P pipes were probably made by James Pitt of Richmond, working 1811 while the G/B is probably George Benson since plain and stamped bowls of his are known from the Putney Bridge site.

I wonder if anyone has investigated the trade directories to see if there was a maker with initials G/C at Chiswick about 1810-20 ?(and from one or two of your illustrations of the kiln site material, probably a bit later, too - I see you date it c.1810-30). The maker's output must have been quite large judging from the amount of different moulds he used. What the bowl with the figures represents I cannot be sure, but as the standing one appears to hold an olive branch and a spear or trident it may commemorate the peace of 1815.
