- 1.- The shape of the bowls.
- 2.- Models with the manufacturer's stamp on the near side of the bowls.
- 3.- Whether they have a heel or not.
- 4.- Decorated TD pipes.
- 5.- TD pipes with letters on the stem.

1.- Amongst the pipes marked with TD there are 11 different bowl shapes, 4 of which have initials in raised letters on the near side of the bowl (See diagrams 9 and 10). The other 7 shapes, (See diagram 6) have a manufacturer's stamp (See diagrams 7 and 8) in the central part on the near side of the bowl. 5 of these 7 shapes have a heel, one doesn't have one and another's must have been broken off if it ever did have one.

2.- There are 15 pipes with the TD stamp, of which 13 have the initials enclosed by raised or smooth circles; one with independent letters; and the decorated ones have the letters surrounded by a geometric shape.

2.1- There are 3 different types of pipes with TD enclosed by circles depending on what accompanies those initials;

- decoration (Types 1,2,3,4,5,6, and 7)
 - a number (Types 12 and 13)
 - another initial (8,9,10, and 11)
- (See diagrams 7 and 8)

2.2.- Models with the TD independent:

A.- Situated on the near side of the bowl, to the right and left of the line which joins the two halves and central as regards to height.

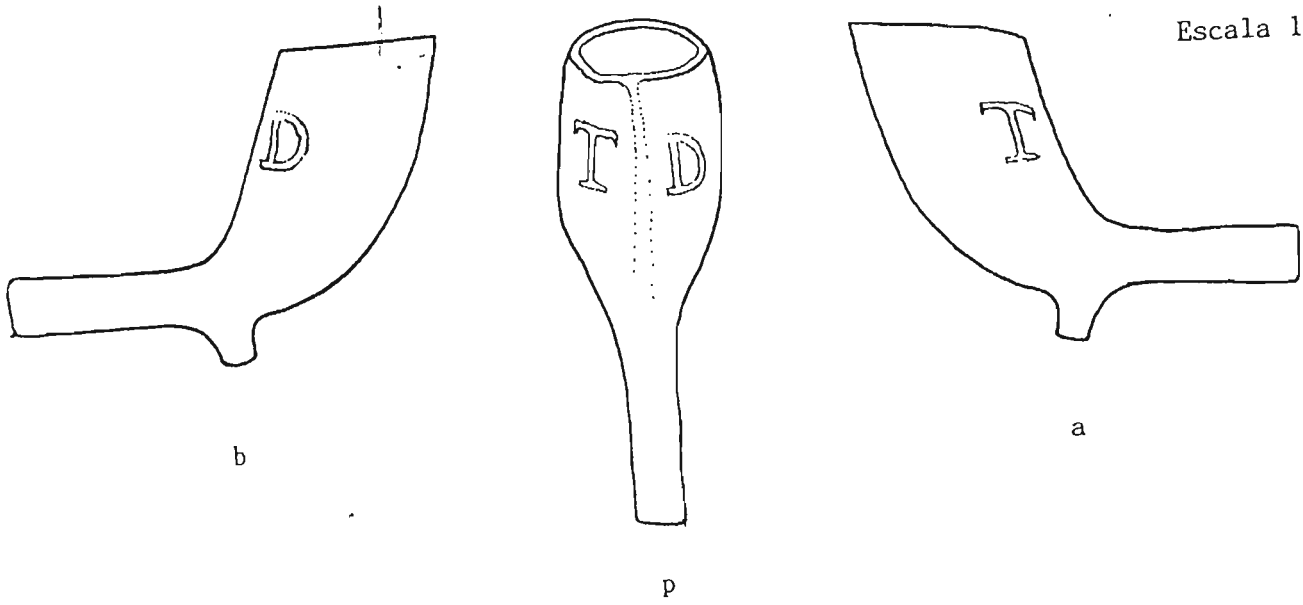


Fig. 2 S83/107/S/1

(See diagrams 9 and 10, fig. 2)

B.- Situated on the near side of the bowl, to the right and left of the joining line of the two halves but on lower part of the bowl, near the stem. (See diagram 10, fig. 4)

C.- Situated opposite the "B", on the near side of the bowl, to the right and left of the joining line but in the larger half, near the border of the bowl

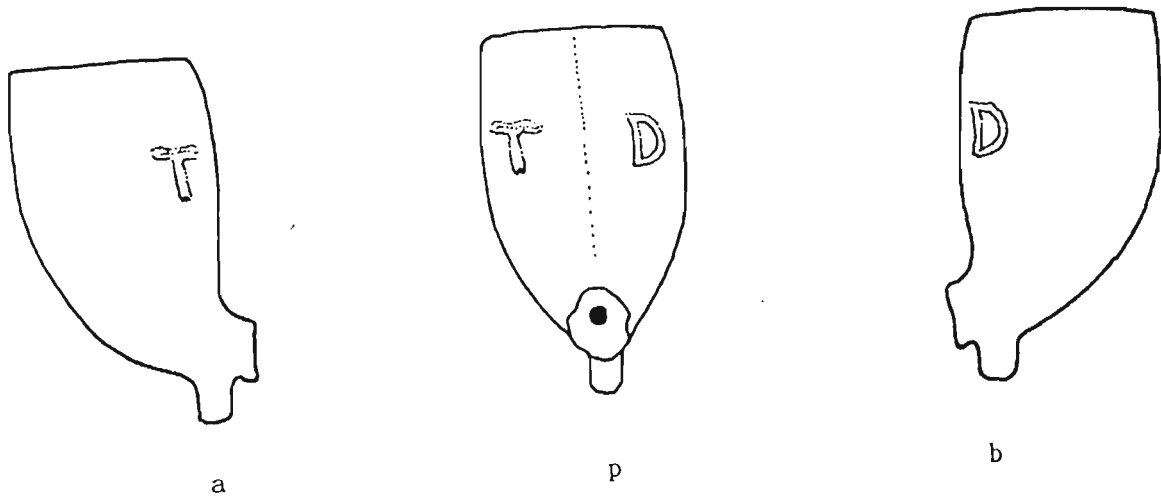


Fig. 3 S83/102/II/487

(See diagram 10, fig. 3)

2.3.- Pipes with TD and decorated bowl.

The two articles we have with a decorated bowl are fragments which make it impossible to determine with any accuracy their shape and decoration. In both cases the initials are enclosed by a geometric shape, a coat-of-arms. (See diagram 11)

3.- the TD pipes, which have a heel or not;

- TD bowls without heel.....2 (2.6%)
- TD bowls with heel.....76 (97.4%)

These heels have many shapes; round, oval, flat, etc. and may be smooth or have the initials TD on their sides.

- Smooth.....11 (23.4%)
- With the initials TD.....36 (76.6%)

There are three types of the latter (diagram 2)

- Type 1 (only with the initials TD)...21 (58.3%)
- Type 2 (initials and drawing).....13 (36.1%)
- Type 13 (initials and 3 stripes).....2 (5.6%)

Type 1 predominates; pipes with the letters TD alone. Pipes with the TD heel also predominate....

4.-The decorated TD pipes consist of

A.- a radiant "sun" with a striped vertical on the bowl's border. The letters are enclosed by a cant-of-arms. (See diagram 2, fig. 2)

5.- There is only one example of this kind of pipe and its number is S87/365/I/1

- On the left side it has the print T 78 WHITE
- On the right side it has the word SCOTLAN
- The heel is broken off
- It has prints on the left and right of the bowl and the initials TD on the heel, towards the centre as regards to height.

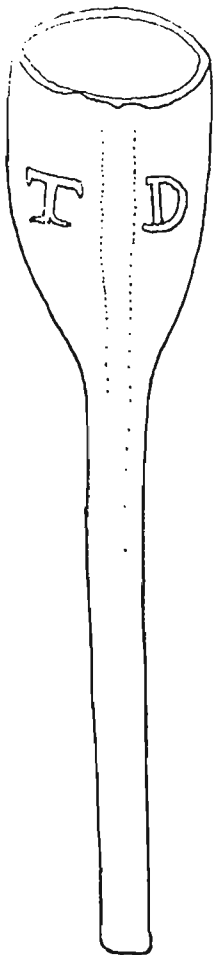
1.4- DECORATED BOWLS

There are a total of 43 pieces in this category. The themes and motifs for the decorations are quite varied as is their condition; some are complete, others reconstructable and others are only fragments that make it impossible to complete the designs. These designs vary from simple leaves on the near or far side of the bowls to highly detailed faces, figures of women or complicated designs of curves, stripes, etc. all moulded in two halves then put together.

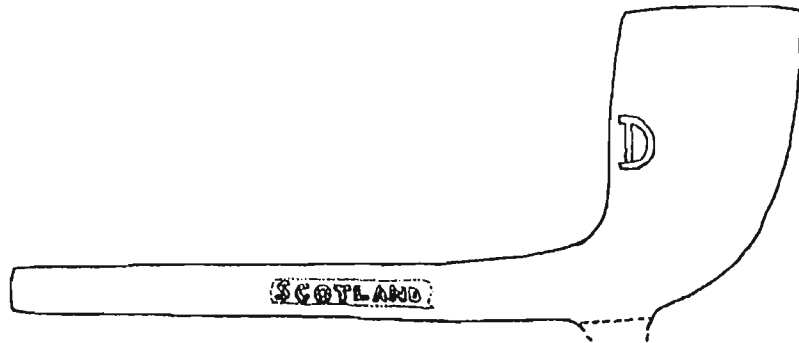

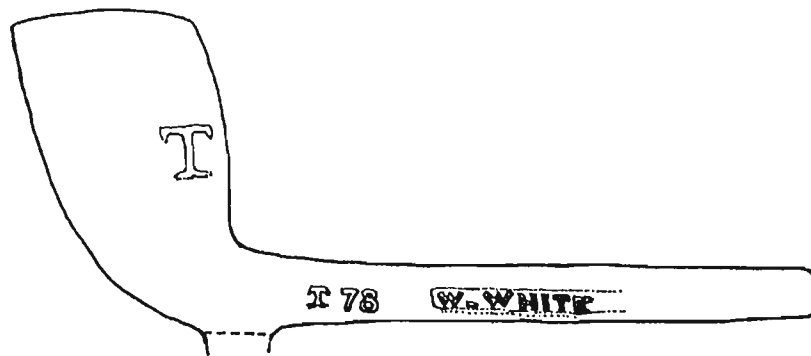

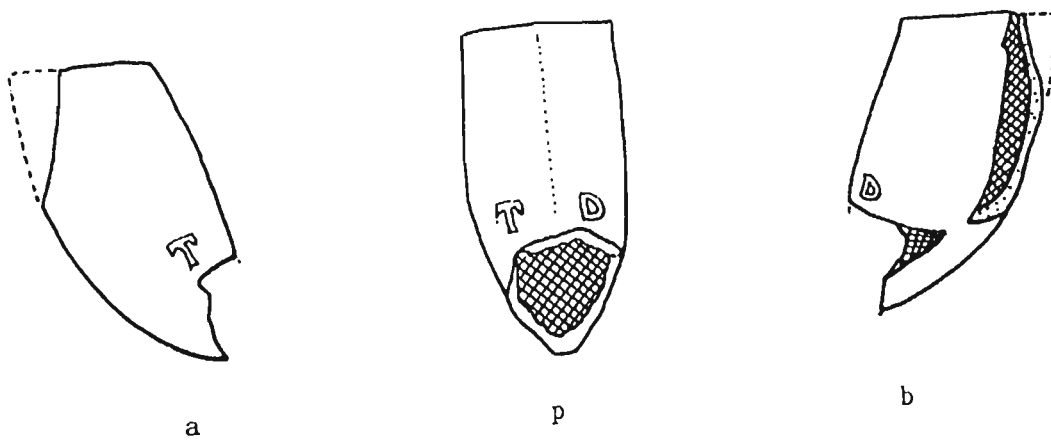


Fig. 4 S83/114/I/10
