### Stamps of Edward Fox

All stamps are resultant of the same die at different stages of damage and alteration; recognisable feature for variation is the four-dot arrangement. Some stamps are extremely clear and suggest that the letters on the die would have been in high relief, c. 1mm or more. The stamps are shown in chronological sequence, and I enclose a photocopy of a recent article on Edward Fox by Martin Nagle, together with one on the Buckland family of Mellisham, also by him.
