Description: Clay tobacco pipe mark index, compiled by Adrian Oswald.


Comments: These are marks with an F surname initial. Arranged alphabetically by Surname (i.e. AF, BF, CF, DF etc.). Each section starts with a typed list of giving details, including provenance for each piece, which have an identifying number that is a simple sequence of numbers (i.e. 1, 2, 3 etc.) occasionally with sub-lists, if there are more than one example (i.e. 1a, 1b, 1c, 2a, 2b, etc).


Storps of Edward Fox

different stages of domage and alteration; recognisable
storps are extremely dear and suggest that the letters
on the die would have been in high valiet, almost arrowe.
The storps are shown in chronological sequence, and
Fox by Martin Norgate, together with one on the
Bruchland family of Mellsham also by him.
