Each section starts with a typed list giving details, including provenance for each piece, which have an identifying number that is a simple sequence of numbers (i.e. 1, 2, 3, etc.) occasionally with sub-lists, if there are more than one example (i.e. 1a, 1b, 1c, 2a, 2b, etc.).

Dear Mr. Oswald,

I recently found part of a clay pipe in my garden and referred to your report, 'Clay Pipes for the Archaeologist' for identification.

I was unable to find a reference to the maker, and reading that relief marks of names on the sides of bowls was comparatively rare on pipes of this style, I decided to ask for your help.

The bowl of the pipe is a creamy fabric without coarse grit. It is not apparant whether the name on the bowl is Iohn Geies or Getes. The bore of the stem is 8/64 inch. There are no marks on the base. A drawing of the pipe is enclosed; I hope this may be of use.

Syresham is situated 10 miles from Banbury, 4 miles from Brackley, 7 miles from Towcester and 8 from Buckingham.

I would be grateful if you can give me any information about the pipe.
