Comments: These are marks with a U-V surname initial. Arranged alphabetically by Surname (i.e. AV, BV, CV, DV, etc.). Each section starts with a typed list giving details, including provenance for each piece, which have an identifying number that is a simple sequence of numbers (i.e. 1, 2, 3, etc.) occasionally with sub-lists, if there are more than one example (i.e. 1a, 1b, 1c, 2a, 2b, etc.).

Dear Editor,

Last December I accompanied an expedition to the Republic of Honduras sponsored by the International Explorer's Society.

While we were interested in pre-Colombian sites, we also sank a trial trench through the remnants of the earthen ramparts of an English fort abandoned to the Spaniards in 1787.

We found a number of old hand-blown bottles, as well as clay pipe stems and the broken pipe bowl illustrated above. The raised letter inscription is found on the rear right-hand side of the bowl.


This bowl was apparently made in Bristol, but the full name of the manufacturer is cut-off by the broken rim.


I would certainly be grateful if you or your readers could give me some idea of who the manufacturer was, as well as the approximate date when pipes of this type were made and exported to English colonies in America. This would greatly assist us in dating the occupation levels at the fort.

I am preparing a brief article on the results of our dig at the fort, which I will be sending you shortly. It was a particularly fascinating experience to excavate pipes and bottles similar to those one finds in England.
