These pipes with the rare initial combination can hardly be any other maker and would indicate a period of manufacture from c1745-75.

Nos 3-5 indicate the use by Watts of the moulds of RB (v.RB) who might be Richard Bryant who took apprentices between 1733-40, Robert Baldwin who polled at Westminster 1749 or perhaps more likely Richard Boucher of Belton St St Giles in the fields who took an insurance 1766. In any case it would seem Watts became a partner or took over the moulds c.1776.
