

A LIST OF THE PIPEWORKERS OF KENT – updated 27 March 2022

Explanatory Notes

This list revises and updates the original list which formed an appendix to my PhD thesis (Liverpool, 2015). The thesis acknowledged, with grateful thanks, the people and organisations helpful when the initial research was completed. The thesis itself is freely available at:

The current list has been sorted by initial order first, followed by the earliest date, and then by surname, and is presented as a PDF. A copy of the list is also available as an Excel table for those wishing to sort the data in different ways.

The term ‘pipeworker’ covers those who made pipes, trimmed pipes, made moulds, were salespeople and assistants. This list records each worker once only, despite the fact that many workers changed the description and location of their work from time to time. Many sources use the description ‘pipe maker’ or ‘tobacco pipe maker’ or ‘clay pipe maker’ as catch-all terms and do not distinguish more precisely the specific role of the worker. As far as possible, the job titles recorded by census enumerators and in published material such as directories have been retained here.

Pipemaking in Kent tended to be a family business in which most family members at some time were active. An unknown number of pipeworkers have left no record of their involvement in this trade. Women seem to be under-represented.

Some pipeworkers moved from place to place – perhaps as a journeyman seeking work, or following a change in family circumstances, or when looking to establish a new business. This list records the likely dominant location(s) within Kent for each worker. Some areas are difficult to separate geographically – this is especially the case for northwest Kent on the London fringe (for example, the locations given as Greenwich, Woolwich, Charlton, Blackheath and Deptford may simply reflect the opinions of the recorders and transcribers and also have boundaries which changed from time to time).

The dates shown are not always reliable – this is particularly true for dates obtained from census returns. Often, the use of census material permits an indication of the approximate year when a pipeworker was born. Dates of death are not known for most workers and so the last datable record is shown in this list. This gives an approximate period during which the workers were involved in the pipe-making trade although some pipeworkers left or joined the trade later in their lives. Pipeworkers for whom there is only a single dated source are usually identified by having identical ‘earliest dates’ and ‘latest dates’.

Where pipemakers share common Christian and surnames the list attempts to remove duplicates so that each “John Smith” shown here should be different from any other with an identical name. To permit a degree of clarity, occasionally it is necessary to follow a surname with a number or given date of birth. The comment column suggests why this may be helpful.

ABBREVIATIONS

The following abbreviations appear frequently in the ‘Work Title’ columns:

PM or Pipe M for pipe maker; CPM for clay pipe maker; TPM for tobacco pipe maker; CTPM for clay tobacco pipe maker; CPT for clay pipe trimmer

In addition, a number of lengthy nouns appear in abbreviated form. Examples include: Manufactr’r or Manuf’r for Manufacturer.

A wide range of sources were available when preparing this list as an appendix to the original thesis. By 2022 direct access to many sources are not now available to me. In consequence, it has not been possible to check all

the original sources even where a possible error has been identified. The most significant exception is the Census records from 1841 to 1911; a number of alterations and additions have been made using this source.
