# SHROPSHIRE – Notes on clay tobacco pipes found at Bishop's Castle

The following notes on pipe finds from Bishop's Castle, Shropshire, were compiled by Graham Berlyn of Ludlow in 1999 and 2000. They are from an extensive archive of his research notes regarding pipes and pipemakers, mainly from in and around Ludlow, which was compiled during the 1990s and 2000s. Following the publication of his booklet on Ludlow area pipes (Berlyn 2008), this archive was passed on to the author, who extracted and scanned these notes in December 2018.

### Trench 1,

1 stem fragment, imported clay, large o/d., i/d.5/64, marked along the axis


in relief serif,4 left hand helical grooves have been pressed into the stem surface before the makers mark, this may indicate the point of balance of a churchwardens pipe, good finish. Maker Noah Roden (2) 1800 - 1855.

- 1 stem fragment, good quality local clay, marked across the stem in relief serif, no bar between lines of letters, fair finish, med.o/d.,i/d.5/64, this maker is not recorded by D.R.Atkinson in his booklet on Broseley pipemakers, however this maker may have lived in that area undocumented in the very late 18th.c.
- 1 Tailed Heel only, good quality local clay, large stem o/d., i/d.8/64, marked



in relief sans serif,fair finish,used,1680 — 1730,Broseley.

- 20 17th.c.stem frags., various o/d., i/d.and finish, all local clay, no marks.
- 3 18th.c. '' '' '' ,imported clay, no marks,
- 2 badly damaged bowls, local clay, both appear to be from the same maker at (Pipe) Aston Herefordshire, both show milling, no bottering left because of the damage, fair finish, 1 is used but not marked, the other is not used but is marked under Round Heel with the wheel mark of an as yet unnamed maker from the village above.Date early 18th.c..
- Bowl type 7a,1720 1740,slight lip damage,thin wall,poor quality local clay, all surfaces are etched probably due to having been in acidic conditions for a long period,spur heel, med. o/d.,i/d.5/64, no mark,used.






Trench 1.

Poppy House, Bishop's Castle.

Bowl type 4b, damaged, 1690 - 1720, good quality local clay, stub heel, no milling, internally trimmed, large stem o/d., i/d.4/64, burnished, unmarked, unused, fair finish.







Bowl type 6a, 1710 - 1740, good quality local clay, burnished, spur heel missing, internally trimmed, med.stem o/d., i/d.5/64, fair finish, no mark, unused.


1 Bowl type 5a, damaged on lip, 1680 - 1730, milled 4/4, bottered, burnished, med.stem o/d., i/d.5/64, Tailed Heel marked sans serif, used. Broseley.

Bowl type uncertain,damaged round lip,late 17th.c.,milled 4/4,no bottering left because of damage,rough local clay,polished, Round Heel marked in relief sans serif, left hand letter illegible,large stem o/d., i/d.7/64,fair finish,unused. Maker unknown.

Trench 2, Area A.

- 1 late 17th.c.mouthpiece, good quality local clay, small stem o/d., i/d.6/64, good finish.
- 1 stem fragment possibly late 18th.c., good quality local clay, marked across the stem IOHN RODEN RODEN Broseley area where other RODEN family members made pipes.
- 1 stem fragment, local clay, med.o/d., i/d.4/64, marked along the stem

(possibly	ANDREW	very feint)	, in relief	serif, this	maker worked 0 - 1720,fair	at Benthall,
	ZBRADLE (Y	().	Shropshir	e about 169	0 - 1720,fair	finish.

- badly damaged and fire burned bowl,type 4b,1690 1720,stub heel,large stem o/d.,i/d.6/64,local clay,no mark.
- 1 broken Tailed Heel, late 17th.c., local clay, marked in relief serif, rough finish, large stem o/d., i/d.7/64.
- 56 17th.c.stem frags., various o/d., i/d.and finish, all local clay, no marks.
- 9 18th.c. '' '' '' '' '' '' '' imported clay, no marks.
- Ann 11 11 11 bowl type 5a, 1680 - 1730, good quality local 1 clay, milling 4/4, slight evidence of bottering, fair finish, large stem o/d., i/d.5/64, Tailed in relief in an oval stamp. Heel marked GWG this mark is one of several used by George Smith of Broseley, Unused. A blob of clay has become attached here to the bowl in the firing process. 1 Bowl type 2b, 1660 - 1680, rough local clay, burnished, Round Heel marked in reverse, milling 4/4, bottered, large stem o/d.. i/d.8/64, letters in relief serif, unused. The only other example of this makers work seen so far is held at Ludlow Museum.and it is known that that piece also came from Bishop's Castle, Maker unknown. (Dr.D.C.Edwards collection). Trench 2, Area B.

The following clay tobacco pipe fragments were found among other artefacts at The Poppy House, Market Square, Bishop's Castle, Shropshire, in the garden at the rear of the house close to the old castle wall, in late August 1999 by Mr.C.Walmsley and a team of helpers from Stockport. The owner of the property is Mr.G.Grimes. The reason for the excavation is that Mr.Grimes

intends to build an extension to the house and before doing so wishes to learn what remains of the castle may exist under the garden before building starts.


- 1 Tailed Heel only, good quality local clay, marked worked in the Broseley area of Shropshire about 1680 - 1720.Large stem o/d., i/d.8/64., fair finish, unused.
  - Stem fragment, imported clay (i e from Devon), med.o/d., i/d.4/64, marked across the stem THO in relief serif, Thomas Taylor worked at Broseley 1750 - 1760. Good finish.
- Badly damaged bowl, type possibly 6b, 1710 1740, good quality local clay, large stem o/d., i/d.4/64, fair finish, no mark, unused.
- 16 stem fragments 17th.c., various o/d., i/d.and finish, all local clay, no marks.

7 stem fragments 18th.c., '' '' '' '' imported clay, no marks.

Trench 3.

These further clay pipe fragments were found during the week ending 30/10/1999, together with other artefacts, and an Aluminium Plate stamped from below with the wording shown in a drawing on sheet 2.



Bowl type 8d,1780 - 1800, partly damaged, imported clay, good finish, internally trimmed, used, no mark, med.stem o/d.,i/d.4/64, spur heel, possibly polished finish.


- 1 Badly damaged bowl, type uncertain, possibly early to mid 18th.c., spur heel, good quality local clay, thin wall, fair finish, large stem o/d., i/d.4/64, used, no mark.
- 1 Mouthpiece, small o/d., i/d.7/64, good quality local clay, fair finish.
- Stem fragment marked with a criss cross pattern, local clay, fair finish, med. stem o/d., i/d.7/64.
- 8 17th.c.Stem frags., local clay, various o/d., and i/d., and finish.
- 6 18th.c.Stem frags., imported clay, various o/d., i/d.and finish.

N.B.Sheet 2 is a drawing of an Aluminium Plate which was found in the same trench as the clay pipes recorded above. This will be found with Bishop's Castle correspondence.

1 bowl type, possible variant of Broseley 3a, 1670 - 1690, milled 4/4, bottered, good quality local clay, round heel marked with the letters L W, in relief serif, in a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch diameter stamp, good finish stroke burnished, large stem o/d., i/d.7/64, used, The name of the maker is presently unknown.
