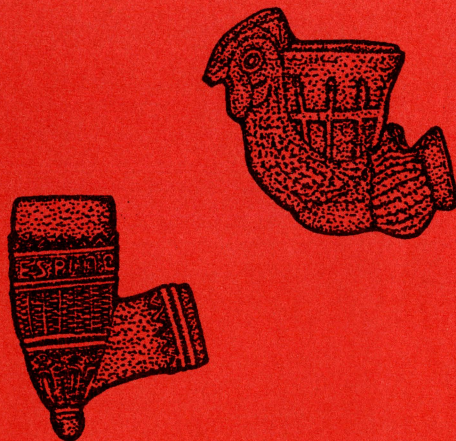

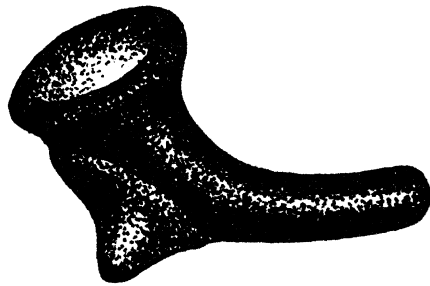


Fig.18 Bog oak pipe in Tenby Museum

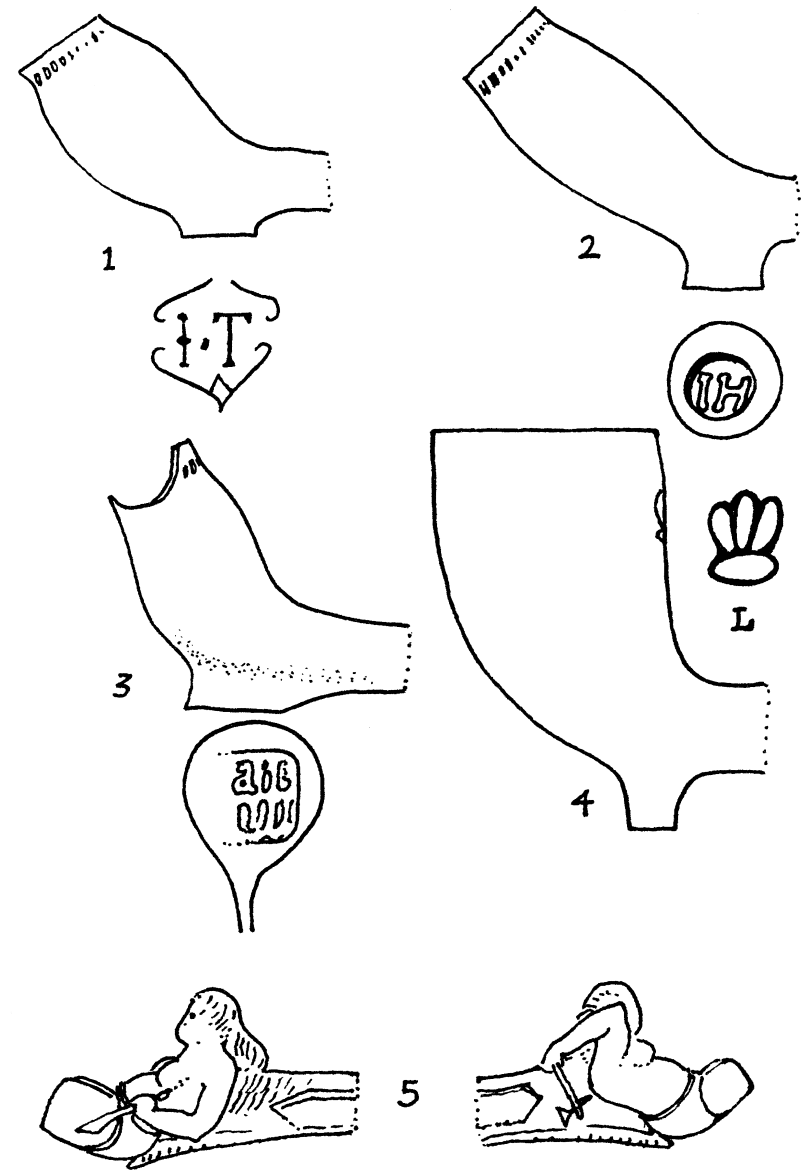


Fig.19 Pipes in Tenby Museum (Scale 1:1)
